I Worley V. Hairston being of sound and disposing mind & memory, but mindful of the certainty of death do make and publish this to be my Last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills made by me, disposing of my estate in Mississippi, Missouri & Florida.

Item 1st This Will is based upon the principle of equality. I have had reference to the advancements made to my children, and I have valued the legacies contained herein, according to my best judgment.

save & except such lands as either one of them have a deed from me, recorded or otherwise to take effect at my death. In the event that there is not enough cash to be realized from these sources, then it shall be optional with each one of the above named parties to pay one fifth of the sum lacking to pay such debts & take possession

of their lands exonerated from my debts, but in case any one of the afore named parties refuse to do so or fail to do so, then it is my Will that the lands bequeathed in this Will to each of such parties so failing, shall remain in the hands of my executors and be by them rented to others or cultivated as they may elect, and the proceeds applied to the payment of such debts against my estate until all just and lawful claims against my estate including the unpaid legacies bequeathed in this Will are paid, after which they shall be given into the possession of those to whom they are devised

Item 3rd It is my Will that all just & lawful claims against my estate including the unpaid legacies bequeathed in this Will shall be paid from the sum or sums due for rents or arrearages the current year in which my death may occur

Item 4th To my son Harden M. Hairston I give the two hundred & forty acres of land on the Magowah and further described as the W^{1/2} of N^W Sec 20, & the W^{1/2} of S^E Sec 17 & the E² of S. E^{1/4} Sec 18 - 240 acres in T 17 R. 17 E -

Item 4th To my son Harden Moody Hairston I give 240 acres of land being part of the Magowah lands and fully described in deed which I have made him to take effect at my death, & I confirm the same to him in this Will -

Item 5th To my son John James Hairston I give all my shares in the Capital stock of the Mobile & Ohio Rail Road Company - These shares may now stand in the name of my deceased husband Peter C. Hairston, and some of them may be in the name of my husband's father Harden Hairston deceased, and the Mobile & Ohio Rail Road Company is authorized to issue, all stock I am entitled to, to my son John James Hairston - I also give to my son John James Hairston

the note which I hold against him for One Thousand Dollars (1000⁰⁰) and release him from the payment of same to my Executors.

Item 5. I give to my daughter Sallie Hairston Ervin wife of D. L. Ervin all the ap^{er} notes and claims of any sort which I hold against her for money loaned her and her husband. She having received and sold her share of the land estate I also give her a fourth interest in my property not otherwise disposed of in this will.

Item 6. I give to my daughter Mary W. (Hairston) Cox wife of James E. Cox my house & lots in the city of Mendon Lauderdale County Miss & known as Lots 5-5 1/2 and 6 Balls survey contained por^{an}ously with this Will I make and deliver to her a Deed to the Lots to take effect at my death - I also give her a fourth interest in my property not otherwise disposed of in this will.

Item 7. I also give to John all my shares in the Capital stock of the Mobile & Ohio Rail Road Company - These shares may now stand in name of my deceased husband Peter C. Hairston and some of them may be in the name of my husband's father Wordin Hairston deceased, and the Mobile

Item 8. To my son George W. Hairston I give the 270 acre tract of land inherited inherited through the estate of Major George Hairston and my husband Dr Peter C. Hairston, The division of the George Hairston estate was made after the death of my husband. It lies in Louisa County Miss^{issippi} & is known as the NE 1/4 & E 1/2 NW 1/4 Sec 26 E 1/2 SW 1/4 & E 1/4 and E 1/2 W 1/4 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 36 T17 R. 17 E. This land is also known as part of Imp Place I have made him a deed to this land to take effect at my death.

A third undivided interest in lot 41 Union Place Kansas City Missouri which I received as a child's part of my husband's estate in Missouri

I also give him one fourth interest in my property undisposed of in this will -

Item 9 - To my son Peter S. Hairston I give a one third undivided interest in my tenth share of the house & lot on Delaware Street Kansas City Missouri (his tenth share in the same house & lot which for purposes of convenience was deeded to me. Also the East half of lot 30, and the West seven feet of lot thirty one, Union Place. These I give back to him) Also a one third undivided interest in lot 41 Union Place all aforesaid in Kansas City Missouri - I also give Peter a half interest in my undivided $\frac{4}{5}$ th of a tract of land known as Pepper Place lying about eight or ten miles from the city of Columbus in the County & State first aforesaid (ie) I give Peter an undivided $\frac{2}{5}$ th interest in said tract of land my Brother in law May J. Watt Hairston owned the other $\frac{3}{5}$ interest in the land mentioned -

Item 10 - To my daughter Alice Hairston Moore wife of Edward S. Moore I give the sum of \$4000. Four Thousand Dollars - Thirty five hundred of this sum is already in her possession, the remaining five hundred are to be paid to her as provided for in Item 3 of this will

Item 11th To my son J. T. Watt Hairston I give all the land which I own in Florida, being a few acres which he gave to me also one half the tract of land already described as four fifths of Pepper Place, I give him $\frac{2}{5}$ of the tract owned by me - I also give him an undivided interest in share of the house and lot on Delaware Street Kansas City Missouri and a one third undivided interest in lot 41 Union Place Kansas City Missouri

Item 12 - To my daughter Patti Hairston Turner wife of William S. Turner I give the tract of

land on which I reside in the County & State first of said four hundred acres to which I have made her a Deed to take effect at my death and which is fully described in said Deed. I also give Patti 160 acres described as S E 4 Section 13 T 17 R 16 E and to her I give all the contents of my residence including household and kitchen furniture and the stock of every kind, and farming implements and the growing or gathered crops on said lands or rents accruing from land bequeathed to her subject only to the charges hereinbefore imposed on said crops. I also give her a fourth share in any remaining property either personal or real which I may not have disposed of in this instrument. I have made her a deed to the $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot No 11 Union Place Kansas City Missouri which I purchased from my son John T. Hairston and confirm the same to her in this Will. She inherited the other half as a legacy from the estate in the division of the Missouri property.

Item 13. For description of the lots I own in Kansas City Missouri, Lot 41 Union Place is one I refer to the various deeds, copies, in the office where deeds of conveyance are recorded in said city. One of the deeds to me was from the heirs of Peter C. Hairston whose names are given in the various items of this Will. Another deed to me (same reference) was from my son John T. Hairston another from Peter S. Hairston a four story brick stone house is situated on one of the lots near the intersection of Main & Delaware Streets. I also refer to the various deeds in same recording office conveying real estate to Peter C. Hairston. He was my husband and I had a tenth interest in his estate he & I having nine children.

Item 14. I request and solemnly enjoin upon my children & grand children homony & family affection to and for each other, and I desire that they contribute liberally to all christian and benevolent causes and especially to the cause of foreign missions of

Item 15: I nominate and appoint my sons George W. Hairston, Peter S. Hairston and J. T. Watt Hairston to be my executors to this my Last Will & Testament and I do hereby exonerate them and each of them from giving any security on the as such in the States of Missouri and Florida, because of the inconvenience and furthermore which ever one or two or three of them may take Auxiliary letters testamentary in the State of Missouri under this Will I confer on him or them plenary power to sell my interest in all property real personal or mixed in Missouri at public or private sale, for cash, or on a credit, to rent it lease it, to make deeds or mortgages or Trust Deeds and to do without orders of Court or decree any thing including the partition or sale for partition of said lands or property which I could do, if I were living, and acting -
