the death of my Brother Andrew Hairston I
give and bequeath to Samuel Philips my Negroe

Item my Tract of Land at Kentucky Con-
taining two thousand acres I give and be-
queath as follows Viz. Two Hundred acres to
Samuel Amos Two Hundred to his wife Eleanor
Amos and the Remainder fourteen Hundred
acres to be Divided among ^{my} said Brother An-
drew Hairstons three Daughters Piffscilla
Margaret and Susanna. I also give to the
said Piffscilla Margaret and Susanna ano-
ther Tract of Land at Kentucky containing
three Hundred and Eighteen acres to them
their heirs and assigns forever. Item I give
and bequeath to my Brother Andrew Hair-
stons Daughter Piffscilla my Negroe boy
Davie to her and her heirs and assigns forever.
Item after all ^{my} Just Dotts and funeral Charges
are paid I leave all the rest of Personal Estate
of every kind together with my Negroe Beck
to my said Brothers three Daughters Piffscilla

Margaret and Susanna Hairston to them and their heirs and assigns forever the Negro Beck to remain in the Possession of their Mother during her Natural life and it is to be Understood that the Legacies bequeathed the said Pussilla Margaret and Susanna shall be Divided in such manner that Margaret and Susanna shall have each as much Money or Land more than Pussilla as will be Equal in Value to the Negro Boy Davie. Lastly I Constitute and Appoint my Trusty friend Robert Alexander Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Ratifying and Confirming this and no other. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of February 1782.
