Hairson from 7 Deed No. 1 This INDENTURE Made this twenty sixth day of march 1798 Between John Head & Ruth his wife of the County of Henry of the one part George Hairson of the County of the other part Witneseth whereof that I Am Head & Ruth his wife for & in consideration of Two Hundred & forty
Pounds in hand paid by the said George Hairson also before the sealing
or delivery of these presents the receipt whereof witness doth bargain
and sell I have confirmed unto the said George Hairson his heirs &
Assigns forever a certain tract piece or parcel of land situate
lying & being in the County of Henry on the waters of Horseshoe Creek
containing four hundred acres more or less & bounded as follows -
To wit Beginning at a corner Maple tree on S^o creek thence along
down the said creek so up hill comes from Gregory Durhams
by a corner W. oak thence along S^o path some distance to a red oak
thence south to a corner black oak sapling thence about east course
along Durhams line to a corner black oak thence an east
course to a spanish oak in Jeph Wills line thence with S^o wotts line
old line to a corner white oak tree thence north to a black oak
tree the north east side of S^o tract of land thence west on the aforesaid
line between Joseph Morris & S^o tract of land to a corner post
Oak

Oak thence a north West along down a branch to a fork that out of so
 Morris's field thence the same bearing to a gum tree still the same course to the
 old line on a white oak sapling, thence South west to a corner black oak
 thence North west to the head of a branch between Joseph Morris's
 tract of land thence down the branch to the lower end of the field, on a
 corner white oak thence round the field to a corner poplar thence a
 North west course to the beginning. With all woods ways water, water
 courses, fucus trees, orchards, houses & all other the improvements
 appertaining or in any way belonging there unto to have & to hold
 the said tract of land to him the said George Haiston his heirs or
 assigns for ever against me my heirs & executors, execessors and
 all and every other person or persons whatsoever either in law or
 equity recovering, claiming or having any just right title or estate
 therein and do by these presents for ever warrant and defend
 the said land & premises above mentioned to the said George Haiston
 his heirs & executors to whom freely to enjoy the same for ever
