John Reid & Ruth his wife of the County of Henry of the one part George
Hairston of s^d County of the other part Witnesseth whereof the said John
Reid & Ruth his wife for & in consideration of Two Hundred & forty
Pounds in hand paid by the said George Hairston at before the executing
or delivery of these presents the Receipt is hereby Acknowledged hath bargained
Sold Released & confirmed unto the said George Hairston his heirs &
Assigns forever a certain Tract piece or parcel of Land situate
Lying & being in the County of Henry on the Water of Horsepasture Creek
& containing four Hundred Acres more or less & bounded as follows -
To wit Beginning at a corner Maple tree on s^d Creek thence along
Down the said Creek to a path comes from Gregory Durhams
on a corner. 16. oak thence along s^d Path some Distance to a Red oak
thence South to a corner black oak Sapling thence South east course
along Durhams line to a corner black oak thence an east
course to a Spanish oak in Depe wotts line thence with s^d wotts line
Old line to a corner white oak tree thence north to a black oak
Tree the north east side of s^d Tract of land thence West on the dividing
line between Joseph Morris & s^d Tract of land to a corner post
Oak

Oak thence a north West along down a branch to a fork that out of 1st Moor is full thence the same course to a gum tree still the same course to the old line on a white oak sapling, thence South West to a corner black oak thence north west to the head of a branch Between Joseph Morris 4th Tract of land thence down the branch to the lower end of the field, on a corner white oak thence round the field to a corner poplar thence a North west course to the beginning, With all woods ways & water, water courses fences trees orchards houses & all other the emoluments appurtenances or on any way belonging, there unto To have & to hold the said tract of land to him the said George Hauston his heirs or assigns for ever against me my heirs & assigns, & against all and every other person or persons whatsoever either in law or Equity recovering, claiming or having any just right title or estate there in and do by this presents for ever warrant and defend.
