WHEREAS, P. C. Hairston deceased, late of said County made in his lifetime his last Will and Testament, which on the 13th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Eighty nine was proved, approved and admitted to Record in said Court, and probate thereof granted to Wentley Virginia Hairston the Execut^{rix} thereof and therein appointed _____ and the said Wentley Virginia Hairston having complied with the provisions of the statute in such case made and provided: THEREFORE, to the intent that the said Will may be well and truly performed, we do give, grant and commit unto the said Wentley Virginia Hairston the administration of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits, of and belonging to the estate of said testator, with full power to take the same into her hands and possession, and to ask, levy, recover and receive the same wherever they may be in this State, hereby requiring and enjoining upon the said Wentley Virginia Hairston to make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits which have or shall come to her hands, possession or knowledge, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons, for her to exhibit the said inventory to our said Court within the time limited by law, to well and truly administer the said goods and chattels, rights and credits according to law; to make a just and true account of her actings and doings therein, when thereto required by our said Court; and to well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said Will, so far as the said goods and chattels, rights and credits will extend and the law charge _____, hereby confirming the said Execut with full and ample authority to dispose of all and singular the said goods and chattels, rights and credits, according to the tenor of said last Will and Testament and the true intent and meaning of the said testator by virtue of these presents.
