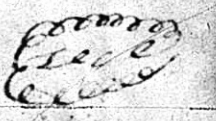


T H B D L T D E V T U R E made the 30th day of May in the year of our Lord 1820 between John Ball and Mary his wife of the one part and Michael Rowland of the other part all of the County of Lee and State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said John Ball and Mary his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold to the said Michael Rowland his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract of Land or parcel of Land containing Thirty acres be the same more or less lying and being in the County of Lee on Indian Creek and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning on the north side of the main Road at the ruins of an old Smith Shop known as Gales being old shop and running directly to Indian Creek and with the meander of said Creek to Buff and Mc Crahan's line and with said line to the main road and with the north side of said road to the beginning being part of the Tract of Land conveyed by David Chadwell Senior to David C. Colwell with the appurtenances thereto belonging To have and to hold the said Tract of Land and all its appurtenances unto the said Michael Rowland his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful title of him the said John Ball and Mary his wife and all other persons whatsoever will warrant

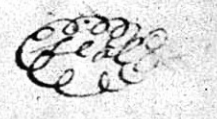

This indenture made this 26th day of December year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty between Dickinson and his wife of the one part and State of Virginia of the one part & Micajah Napper of the other part of the County and State aforesaid witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred Dollars to him in hand the said Samuel Dickinson paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained and sold unto the aforesaid Micajah Napper a certain tract of Land or parcel lying and being in Lee County and State of Virginia on the north side of Powell's river and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning on a gum tree in a hollow near so nappers field on his line running thence S 44 E 70 poles to a sawer was tree in a flat thence S 78 E 59 poles crossing a path and by a white walnut to a white oak and dogwood on the original line thence a spring called or known by the name of Buckhorts spring thence with a diagonal line N 2 W 140 poles to two Chestnuts by a hollow corner to said line thence N 88 W 77 poles to a Chestnut tree dogwood & poplar at a sink corner to so napper and with his line S 19 W 77 poles to a poplar on a bushy ridge thence with the nappers line S 84 W to the beginning containing about eighty eight acres be the same more or less to have and to hold the tract of land as above described with all & singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the sole use & behoof of him of Micajah Napper his heirs
