Code of 1930, Section No. 2364. Return of Certificate and Penalty for Failure. A Certificate of Marriage, signed by the minister, judge, justice, or other officer celebrating the same—or, in case of Quakers, Mennonites, or other societies that solemnize their marriages by consent of parties taken in open congregation, by the clerk of the society—shall be transmitted by such minister, judge, justice, or clerk, within three months thereafter, to the Clerk who issued the license to be recorded; and an exemplification thereof shall be evidence of the marriage; and every minister, judge, justice, or clerk of a religious society failing to transmit such Certificate to the Clerk within the time prescribed, shall forfeit and pay to the Clerk who issued the license, and who may sue for the same, the sum of fifty dollars. The Clerk shall examine the records once a month, and if any such person be found in default, he shall institute inquiry, and, learning who he is, shall issue a summons for such defaulter, returnable before himself, requiring a return of the Certificate; and such person so in default shall pay the costs thereof.
