(286) the highest bidder on twelve months credit, all my household and kitchen furniture not willed to my heirs and the money to be appropriated to the payment of my Just debts and my funeral expenses.

Item 16th, It is fubther my will that all my negroes, stock, of all kinds and of every description, of farming utensils, and what soever may be for the benefit of the farm, shall remain on the farm under my son Benjamin aforesaid, until the crop of 1846 be gathered in, but nevertheless it is my will that my executors make sale of all my hogs, cattle and sheep, after the first day of August next, either for cash or on Credit as they may think proper, also it is my will that after the crop aforesaid shall be gathered in, my executors advertise and sell all my remainder of my stock and utensils of every description, on Twelve months credit, the purshases in all cases giving Bond and approved security, and the proceeds first to go to the payment of my Just debts and the balance to be equally divided among my heirs, and lastly, I make and ordain my friend James Bright and my two sons Benjamin Warren & Thomas R. Warren, my executors to this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Twenty-Third day of January in the year of our Lord, one Thousand eight hundred and fortysix. Codicil. February 24th 1846. I, HENRY WARREN, do continue weak in Body, but of sound mind, and in consequence of the Great Trouble and expense which I have been to my three children. Benjamin Warren, Emeline & Caroline, my two Daughters, I give and bequeath to the three above mentioned Children my negro Girl. Masouri, to dispose of among themselves Jointly, as they may think proper, and the 14th Item in my above last will and testament is hereby made null and void, and no other part thereof to be in anyway affected by this alteration.
