TO ALL TO WHOM these Presents shall come, GREETING: KNOW YE, That by virtue of four Land Office Treasury Warrants Numbers ten thousand six hundred and thirty seven, twelve thousand four hundred and twenty eight, twenty thousand three hundred and fifty four, and eleven thousand two hundred and sixty five There is Granted by the said Commonwealth unto George Hairston a certain tract or parcel of Land containing three hundred and sixty two Acres by Survey bearing date the twenty ninth day of March one thousand seven hundred and ninety three, lying and being in the County of Henry and bounded as followeth to wit. Beginning at a Locust in William Layton's line, South 65 degrees East 164 poles to a post Oak in John Kelleys line with it North 84 poles to a Chestnut tree, North 29 degrees East 104 poles to a Gum and pointers in Chennings line, with his South 84 degrees West 154 poles to a White Oak, North 29 degrees & 30 minutes West 284 poles to a dogwood in Boshears's line with his North 78 degrees West 105 poles to pointers Gallies line with his South 8 degrees West 140 poles to a red Oak in Wilson's line with his line South 73 degrees and thirty minutes East 98 poles crossing two branches to a White Oak South 11 degrees & 30 minutes West 229 poles to the Beginning

with its Appurtenances; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract or Parcel of Land with its Appurtenances, to the said George Hairston and his Heirs for ever.
