✓ John Ferguson is Allowed 15/8. for 70 Sheaves of Oats & 20 Bushells of Corn furnished the Guards with the British Prisoners from the Southward to Winchester

✓ Also Allowed 6/9. for 9¹/₂ lb Bacon for the use of Henry Militia on their March to join Lt. Green

✓ Joseph Seales is Allowed £15.17.3. for 4 Bushells of Corn, 840 Sheaves of Oats, 212¹/₂ lb Bacon & 3¹/₂ Bushells Meal, furnished Geo. Ferguson 2. M. P. of Lieut. Col. Lus Light Dragoons, West 1781

✓ Robert Powell is Allowed 5/- for 3. M. P. 33 Dicks & one Bushell of Corn furnished the Commissioner of Provisions
