more especially for and in Consideration of the sum of Thirty Shillings of good and  
lawful Money for our Use paid to our Receiver General of our Revenues in this our Colony  
and Dominion of Virginia We have given Granted and Confirmed and by these Presents  
for our Heirs and Successors Do Give Grant and Confirmation unto Robert Hairston  
one certain Tract or Parcel of Land containing three hundred Acres lying and being in  
the County of Albemarle on the Branch of Beaver Creek of the Fluvanna and bounded as  
followeth, to wit. Beginning at an Hickory Sapling Samuel Hairston's Corner by  
a small Branch of Beaver Creek and running thence on the said Hairston's Line  
South fifteen Degrees East one hundred and fifty Poles crossing the Creek to a white  
Oak Sapling thence new Line West - forty two Poles to an Hickory Sapling South seventy  
Degrees West eighty six Poles crossing the same Creek to Pointers North thirty  
Degrees West two hundred and sixty Poles to a Dogwood by a Branch North sixty  
Degrees East two hundred and forty six Poles to Pointers thence South one hundred  
and seventy two Poles crossing a large Branch to the Beginning With all &c.  
to have hold &c. To be held &c. Holding and Paying &c. Provided &c.  
In Witness &c. Witnesses our trusty and well beloved Robert Dinwiddie Esquire  
our Lieutenant Governor and Commander in chief of our said Colony and  
Dominion at Williamsburgh Under the Seal of our said Colony the tenth Day of  
September One thousand seven hundred and fifty five In the twentieth
