Benjamin Harrison Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia to all to whom these presents shall come grete Greeting. The manner that in consideration of the sum of fifteen Shillings Sterling paid by Robert Hairston into the treasury of this Commonwealth. There is Granted by the said Commonwealth in to the said Robert Hairston a certain tract or parcel of Land containing one hundred and thirty two Acres by Survey bearing date the Ninth day of May one Thousand Seven hundred and eighty. Lying and being in the County of Henry on the Waters of Runnells Creek and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a corner white Oak in his own line thence with his own line south eighty degrees West. twenty two poles to a hickory south twenty five degrees West. one hundred and eight poles to a poplar once branch thence New line south twenty six degrees East. fifty six poles to a Locust East. one hundred and fourteen poles crossing two branches to a white Oak North twenty three degrees East ninety five poles to pointen in ballways of Court line thence with it North twenty five degrees West. sixty seven poles to the said Hairstons own line thence with it North sixty five degrees West. thirty five poles to the first station with its appurtenances. to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances to the said Robert Hairston and his heirs forever. In Witness whereof the said Benjamin Harrison Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the first day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred and eighty two. and of the Commonwealth the sixth
