Benjamin Harrison Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia to
 all to whom these presents shall come: Greeting: Knowye that in consideration
 of the ancient Composition of fifteen Shillings Sterling paid by Robert Harrington
 into the treasury of this Commonwealth, there is granted by the said Common-
 wealth unto the said Robert Harrington a certain tract or parcel of land containing
 one hundred and fifty three acres by Survey bearing date the tenth day of
 May one thousand seven hundred and eighty, lying and being in the County
 of Henry adjoining his own land on Topping bog creek, and bounded as follows:
 to wit Beginning at a white oak and Mulberry tree on the said creek thence new
 line North twenty six degrees west, one hundred and eighteen poles to a beech
 and a branch thence up as it meanders North fourteen poles to a fork thence
 up the south fork North seven degrees west, twenty poles to a beech thence new line
 North twelve degrees east, twenty eight poles to a white oak beginning a road North
 forty five degrees west, eighty eight poles crossing a branch to an old line thence
 with it North twenty degrees west, one hundred and twelve poles to a Chestnut
 tree South eighty poles to the said creek thence down it as it meanders to the
 first Station, with its Appurtenances, to have and to hold the said tract or
 parcel of land, with its Appurtenances, to the said Robert Harrington and his
 heirs forever In witness whereof the said Benjamin Harrison Governor of
 the Commonwealth of Virginia, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused
 the Great Seal of the said Commonwealth to be Affixed at Richmond
 on the first day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand
 seven hundred and eighty two and of the Commonwealth the
 Seventh
