Thomas Jefferson Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

Know ye that in consideration of the ancient composition of forty shillings sterling paid by Andrew Hairstone into the Treasury of this Commonwealth there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Andrew Hairstone a certain tract or parcel of Land containing four hundred Acres by Survey bearing date the Thirteenth day of January One thousand seven hundred and Seventy three Lying and being in the County of Bedford on the head branches of Dogwood branch; and Bounded as followeth, to wit Beginning at John Dales and sticks corner pine at a branch; thence along Sticks Lines, South seventy five degrees East: One hundred and seventy poles to his corner pine, South forty two degrees East, One hundred and four poles to his and Heath's corner pine; thence along Heath's Lines, North forty six poles to his corner white Oak; North twenty two degrees West forty six poles to his corner Red Oak; North five degrees East, One hundred and forty six Poles to his corner black Jack; North forty degrees East sixty poles to his corner pine; thence off North thirty six degrees West, Two hundred and fifty poles to a small white Oak on Arnold's Line; thence along his Lines south eighty degrees West, One hundred and forty two Poles to his corner Pine; South forty degrees West seventy two poles to Dales corner small white Oak; thence along Dales Lines, ^{South} sixty seven degrees East; two hundred and four poles to his corner large white Oak on a branch; South twenty two degrees East; One hundred and thirty two poles to his corner pine South sixty five degrees West One

hundred and fifty poles to his corner pine: and south thirteen
 degrees west twenty four poles to the first station with its
 Appurtenances; to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land.

 in the County of Augusta on the west side of his other Tract
 and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a burch and
 Locust East fiftytwo poles to a Large white Oak his old corner
 North one hundred and sixty six poles to a red Oak then South
 Seventynine degrees East thirty seven poles to a hickory Gum and
 Dogwood James Bells corner North thirtythree degrees west
 Eighty six poles to a chesnut and white Oak said Bells corner
 North thirty one degrees East thirty eight poles to a white Oak
 thence west fiftytwo poles to two chesnuts trees South
