ye that in Consideration of the ancient composition of Two pounds ten  
Shilling paid by Andrew Haustone into the Treasury of this Commonwealth  
there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Andrew Haustone  
a certain tract or Parcel of Land containing Four hundred Acres by  
Survey bearing (date the eighth day of November one thousand seven hundred  
and Seventy seven lying and being in the County of Bedford on both sides of  
Burns bridge branch and on both sides of the Main Road to New London  
and bounded as followeth (to wit) Beginning at Charles Cuffeys corner  
five Paces the Spurs of the Long Mountain thence New Lines North twenty  
= eight degrees East sixteen poles to a Shrub white Oak South forty five de=  
= grees East sixteen poles to Pointers North fifty five acres East thirty four poles to a  
Spanish Oak North seven degrees East fifty four poles to a branch of Chesnut North  
fifty degrees East fifty two poles to a White Oak East thirty two poles to a black  
Spur just over a branch North thirty two degrees East thirty two poles to a branch of  
Chesnut on Hoylers line so far near and over the Spurs of Long Mountain thence  
along Hoylers line North thirty degrees West twenty four poles to a corner black  
Oak thence off North fifty degrees West crossing the branch and the Road  
to a red Oak South forty degrees West Seventy poles to a Spur South

twenty degrees West thirty poles to his corner South seventy degrees West  
to a pine North twenty degrees West one hundred and sixteen poles to a double pine  
South seventy degrees West two hundred poles to his corner South twenty degrees East

line North seventy three degrees East thirty eight poles to his corner five South
