This Indenture made this 27th day of April in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty one Between Samuel Harston of the County of Bedford of the one Part and William Snodgrass of the other Part Witnesseth that the said Samuel Harston for and in Consideration of the sum of Thirty Pounds to him in hand paid by the said Wm. Snodgrass the Receipt Whereof the Samuel Harston hath Bargained Sold and Alien'd and Confirmed and by these Presents doth Bargain and Sell alien and Confirm unto the said William Snodgrass his Heirs and assigns forever one Certain Tract or Parcel of Land containing Three Hundred & Ninety acres lying & being in the County of Bedford on both sides Bear Creek and Bounded as Followeth to wit Beginning at Thomas Read Corner Pine Thence off South thirty three Degrees East one Hundred and Twelve Poles to a Red oak Thence North sixty four Degrees East seventy two Poles to a Pine thence south thirty six Degrees East thirty four Poles to a White oak Thence south sixty two Degrees East fifty Poles to Pointers on said Creek Thence North Nineteen Degrees West ninety two Poles to a great Pine Thence North sixty six degrees West two Hundred and
