 poles crossing the Creek to a White Oak thence North Ten Degrees West
 Hundred and fifty four poles to a Hickory thence South Eighty Seven
 poles crossing the Creek to a pine thence South forty Two Degrees
 Two Hundred and Twenty one poles to a White Oak thence south East
 poles to a pine thence South fifty four Degrees East Sixty poles to a Red
