My dear Sir  
I of Virginia, to all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting: Know ye  
that in consideration of the Ancient Composition of thirty Shillings  
Sterling paid by Samuel Hairstone into the Treasury of this Commonwealth  
there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Samuel Hairstone  
a certain tract or parcel of Land containing three hundred Acres by  
Survey bearing date the thirty first day of March, One thousand seven  
hundred and seventy two, lying and being in the County of Bedford  
on branches of Beaver Creek; and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning  
at Brown's and Lynch's dividing corner pointers thence a long Brown's  
Lines South forty five degrees West ninety two poles to his corner black  
Jack: South sixty five degrees West thirty six poles to his corner Red Oak: thence  
off South fifty two degrees West, Eleven poles to a small red Oak: North seventy  
two degrees West, One hundred and two poles to a small red Oak: North  
thirty degrees West seventy eight poles to a pine: North ten degrees East  
forty eight poles to pointers; East ninety six poles to a pine on the west  
side of Cooper Mountain; South forty eight poles to a shrub white Oak  
in a point of Rocks on the South end of the said Mountain: East thirty  
two poles to a pine. North thirty seven degrees East, one hundred  
and eighteen poles to a chestnut. North thirty poles to a black Jack

My grant was made out when Thomas Jefferson was Governor  
and was an ultra being kept. Perhaps it is O.K. to be called in  
the name of Mr. Jefferson

North twenty five degrees East, forty four poles to a pine on the East side of the  
 said Mountain: South seventy degrees East, sixty four poles to a pine: North  
 thirty degrees East, seventeen poles to a pine: North seventy five degrees East  
 thirty six poles to a black Oak: South thirty eight degrees East, One hundred  
 and thirty poles to Pointers on Lynch's Line: thence along his Lines South  
 sixty five degrees West, One hundred and thirty poles to his corner pine and  
 South forty five degrees West, One hundred and twenty poles to the first  
 Station with its Appurtenances; to have and to hold the said tract or parcel  
 of Land, with its Appurtenances, to the said Samuel Hairstone and his ...  
 Heirs forever. In Witness whereof the said Benjamin Harrison Governor of  
 the Commonwealth of Virginia, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the  
 Lesser Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the  
 first day of September in the year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred  
 and eighty <sup>two</sup> and of the Commonwealth the ~~fifteenth~~
