to all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Know ye that in  
consideration of the Ancient Composition of thirty shillings Sterling  
paid by Samuel Hairstone into the Treasury of this Commonwealth

there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said

Samuel Hairstone a certain Tract or parcel of Land containing

two hundred and sixty five Acres by Survey bearing date the

twenty fifth day of June one thousand seven hundred and

seventy four formerly surveyed for Thomas Leno who is

absconded and by the Sheriff returned insolvent dying and

being in the County of Bedford on both sides of the North fork

of Seneca Creek and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at

Nelson corner large white Oak thence along his line North forty


Six degrees West one hundred and forty six poles to his own corner

Small shrub white Oak thence along his own line North seventy

four degrees East one hundred and forty six poles to his

corner pine North eight degrees East One hundred and ninety poles to his corner

 poles to Douglas corner red Oak: thence along his line South sixty four poles  
 to his corner small Hickory South seventy two degrees West seventy eight

 said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the first day of September  
 in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and eighty and of the  
 Commonwealth the fifth.
