 after her death My will is that Cloe Hanners Child & her Children
 if she has any be equally divided & left to Peter Hunter, Samuel
 Hunter, Peyton Hunter Alexander Hunter & Cowhatan Hunter
 to them and their heirs for ever and My wife Martha
 Hunter is to have the third of all My other Negroes and
