

Hairston Be it Known to all whom it may concern that I Elizabeth W. Hairston of Elizabeth W. Franklin County in the State of Virginia in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia passed June 27<sup>th</sup> 1870 intituled an act "To provide in what manner and on what conditions a householder or head of a family shall set apart and hold a Homestead and Personal property to him or for benefit of himself and family, exempt from sale for debt" do hereby declare and make Known that I have this day selected and set apart as a Homestead the following lands. - Viz. One tract of eighty acres, and one of three hundred and twenty, situated on Turners creek and its branches in said county adjoining the lands of D. Saunders Jr. Perry Ferguson, George Woods, deceased worth eighteen hundred dollars said land or property being that in excess of the property exempt from levy or distress under the laws of Virginia in force on the day the present Constitution went into force. The Homestead so selected and set apart as aforesaid to be held by myself and family, free from and exempt from all levy, seizure - garnisheing or sale under any execution, order or other process as provided for in said act - the full benefit of which is hereby claimed for myself and family. - Witness the following signature and seal this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of Jan'y 1871.
