This Indenture made this 5th day of June 1822
between Charles Chamberland of the County of Cumberland
and State of Kentucky of the one part and Matthew Amys
of Cumberland County and State aforesaid of the other part
Witness that the said Charles Chamberland for and in consid-
eration of the sum of two thousand dollars in hand paid
that receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bar-
gained and sold; and by these presents do grant, bargain &
sell unto the said Matthew Amys a certain tract or parcel
of land containing by survey three hundred & forty five acres more
or less lying and being in the aforesaid County of Cumber-
land on the waters of Maraboner Creek and bounded as
followeth - To wit: Beginning on a military survey made
in the name of Wm. Hoffman at a beech, white walnut and
sugar tree thence with said military line N 83° 11' 30" E 110 poles to a white
oak and two beeches, thence S 85° 11' 30" E 110 poles to two beeches
corner to Jas. White, thence S 87° 1/2' W 116 poles to two beech & sycamores
thence S 7 1/2° E 110 poles to a buckeye and two beeches, thence S 87 1/2°
E 110 poles to a beech, thence S 30° 12' 30" E 110 poles to three sugar trees on a
branch in St. Vories line, thence with his line N 85° E 94 poles to a
black walnut, white oak and hickory in Charles Chamberland's
line, thence with his line S 5° E 94 poles to a black walnut, sugar tree
and ash, corner to Charles Chamberland's 50 acre survey,
thence S 30° 12' 30" E 110 poles to a beech in the line of Wm. Stan, and
with his line, S 15° 11' 30" E 110 poles to two black locust saplings on a ridge
then leaving Stan's line N 63° E 110 poles to a sugar tree, thence North
50 poles to a hickory and two beeches, corner to 1st Chamberland's
50 acre survey, thence with his line N 30° E 100 poles to a walnut
corner to Hoffman's military survey, thence with the line of said
survey N 30° E 63 poles to the Beginning - To have and to hold
the said tracts or parcel of land with all the appurtenances thereto
belonging unto the said Matthew Amys, his heirs and assigns
forever; and the said Charles Chamberland for himself and his heirs the
aforesaid tracts or parcel of land with its appurtenances, unto
