This Indenture made and entered into the twentieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two between Samuel Rush and Treby his wife of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky of the one part, and Henry Rutledge of the County & State aforesaid - Witnesseth; That the said Samuel Rush and Treby his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to him in hand paid the receipt which is hereby fully acknowledged have gave, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, confirmed and conveyed, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, confirm and convey unto the said Henry Rutledge his heirs & assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of land on which the sd. Samuel Rush now lives situated lying and being in the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky, bounded & described as follows - To wit - Beginning at a hickory and beech on the South bank of Norton's fork of Mill Creek, corner to George Richardson's survey, thence down said Creek North
