Moseley, L.) my last Will and Testament: I desire that my
Will.) just debts be paid by the sale of my Crop,

may think proper: I give unto my wife Rebecca
C. Moseley the Land and plantation on which I now
live, also all my Negroes, plantation utensils, household
furn^e, stock of every kind, (except a horse for my
son Jno. T. Moseley, and a sorrel Filley for Wm:) during

her life, for the purpose of supporting and educating
my children; but request four of the s^d Negroes viz.
Nell Betty, and George, also miranda, be given up to
my Daughter Martha A. Moseley, should she marry in
her Mother's lifetime, or not, to her and her heirs forever:
I give unto my ^{son} Jno T. Moseley two negro Boys, viz: Julius
and Adam; and unto my son Wm: A. Moseley, four Ne-
gro Boys, viz Pleasant, Dennis, Harry, and Jim, to them
and their heirs severally forever: The Negroes (and other
Est: given my Wife) not herein named, I desire may be
divided equally among my above named Children at
their Mother's death, except the land, which I request
may be sold by my Executors, and the money equally
divided between my above named sons; should either
of whom die under Age, I wish his portion of Negroes,
Money arising from the sale of the land, and other Est:
Willed him, go to the surviving one: The remaing
part of my Estate of every description, not herein nam-
-ed, I wish divided equally among my three above
named Children, should there be any after paying
my debts: Lastly, I appoint my Wife Executrix and
Armstead T. Townes, and Maj^r Edward Moseley Executors
of this my last will and Testament, I request that
there be no Inventory taken or appraisement of my
Estate: In testimony whereof I have hereto put my
seal, and written this my s^d Will & Testament with
my own hand this fourteenth day of July eighteen
hundred and fourteen

and Robert Moseley, and thereupon the same
was ordered to be recorded: and

who entered into bond with security and took the
oath prescribed by law, a certificate is granted them
for obtaining probat thereof in due form.--

of all and singular the goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased
which have or shall Come to the hands possession or knowledge of him
the said George Taylor or into the hands or possession of any other person
or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit into the County
Court of Powhatan when he shall be thereunto required by the said
Court and such goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly admin-
ister according to law, and further do make a just and true acc-
ount of his actings and doings thereon when thereunto required by
the said Court - and all the rest of the said goods chattels and
credits which shall be found remaining upon the accounts of the
said asmor: the same being first examined and allowed by the
Justices of the said Court for the time being, shall deliver and
pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law
and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testa-
ment was made by the deceased, and the same be proved in
Court and the said George Taylor do in such Case being required
render and deliver up his Letters of administration, then this oblig-
ation to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue ---
