This Indenture made and entered into this 15<sup>th</sup> day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five by & between George Rowland Betsy his wife, of Harlan County and State of Kentucky, of the one part and George Hoskins of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that, for and in consideration of the sum of eight hundred dollars to them the said George Rowland and Betsy his wife, in hand paid by the said George Hoskins before signing and sealing these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath this day bargained, and sold and by these presents, do bargain and sell unto the said George Hoskins one certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred & thirty, more or less, situated in Lee County on Indian Creek and bounded as followeth to wit. beginning on a white Oak marked W. C. thence running straight line till it intersects with Indian Creek to white oak including the widow Core's house thence up the creek and crossing the said creek till it intersects with Cottrell's line thence with said line till it intersects with David Chadwell Junr's line, thence with said line crossing the creek till it intersects with William Chadwell's line thence with said line till it intersects Alexander Chadwell's line thence with said line till it intersects with Peter Rowland's line, thence down the branch till it intersects with Alexander Stewart's line thence with said line to the Beginning, To have & to hold the above tract of land with and singular the appertinances in any wise belonging or appertaining thereto unto said George Hoskins, his heirs and assigns forever from the said George Rowland and Betsy his wife, their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns and from all persons claiming by, through or under them or either of them and from all other persons forever will warrant and defend the same, in testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals the day and date first written.
