Witnesses our and wellbeloved Robert Dinwiddie Esquire our Lieut^e Governor & Commander in our said Colony and Dominion at Williamsburgh Under the Seal of our said Colony the tenth Day of September One thousand seven hundred and fifty five In the ninth Year of our Reign.
