

In consideration of the natural love
and affection that I have for my son
John C Baker, now a citizen of
Memphis Tennessee, and also in
consideration of the further sum of
one dollar to me in hand paid by
the said John, the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged. I give and
set over to the heirs of said John C.
Baker, and their heirs &c. forever, a
certain negro girl named Fanny -
about Eleven years old, now in the
possession of said John C Baker, and
believed to be worth about six hundred
dollars, I mean the children of said
John C Baker that may hereafter be
born, as well as those that may now
be living, and should any of the heirs
and children of said John die - leaving
no children, and heirs, his or her
interest is to descend to the surviving
brothers & sisters and their heirs - and
it is further to be understood that
the said John C Baker, is vested with
no right or title to said slave, and
that said slave under no circumstan-
ces is in any way to be subject
to the debts or contracts of said John
C Baker or his representatives
