In the name of God Amen I Thomas Bouldin

of Henry County Virginia being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory thanks to God for his mercies, Calling to mind that it is ordained for all men once to die, do make this my last will and

Testament, First I desire to be buried in Christian like form, hoping for happiness in the world to come through the merits of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ

Item I desire all my just debts to be paid

Item my worldly goods I dispose of as follows, I give and bequeath to my son Green Bouldin & his heirs forever

a certain negro man named Charles and no more of my Estate in Slaves - Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Bouldin and his heirs forever a certain negro man named Abram and no more of my Estate in Slaves

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Bouldin and his heirs forever a certain negro woman named Aggy her child and all her future increase and no more of my Estate in Slaves - Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Polly Rowland one negro boy named Jack one negro woman named Sally and her increase which negroes are now in her possession and Fifty Dollars to be paid her in twelve months after my death and no more of my personal or perishable Estate -

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Patsy Moseby for the life time of my D^r Daughter Patsy and then the children of D^r Daughter Patsy a negro boy named George and negro woman named Betty and the future increase of D^r Slaves and Fifty dollars to be paid in twelve months after my death and no more of my personal or perishable Estate

Item I give to my friend and neighbour Genl. John Dillard of Henry County in trust the following Slaves viz a negro woman Micca negro man Martin & a negro woman Jimmy and their increase except Jordan the hire of D^r Slaves to be applied to the maintenance of my Daughter Nancy & Potter late Nancy & Rowland during her life and then the D^r Slaves and increase to be equally divided between the children of the D^r Nancy & Potter excepting from D^r division Mary Ann Rowland her first child daughter

Item I give to my Granddaughter Mary Ann Rowland and her heirs forever a negro boy Jordan as trustee my friend Gen John Dillard will take possession of sd boy apply the hire to the support and education of my sd Granddaughter, and surrender full possession of sd boy to my Granddaughter when she becomes of age or marries — Item I give to my Daughter Nancy C Potter and my Granddaughter Mary Ann Rowland the whole of my landed estate to be divided between them as follows, beginning at a corner white oak on the meadow branch running a straight line to the Bridge where the main road crosses the creek thence with the road to the back line I give and bequeath to my Granddaughter Mary Ann Rowland and her heirs forever all the Land on the south side of sd line and all on the north side I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy C Potter and her heirs forever which Land so given to be managed in any way which Gen John Dillard as trustee may think most advisable for the benefit of my sd Daughter and Granddaughter —

Item it is my will and desire that my negro man Toby be sold by my Executors to the highest bidder and that the money be equally divided amongst my sons Green, Thomas & William,

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy C Potter and my Granddaughter Mary Ann Rowland all the balance of my estate not heretofore given the title of which property is vested in Gen John Dillard, subject to his management and control but for their benefit equally — Item It is my will that my faithful negro man Bob be free and I hereby declare him free Lastly I appoint my friend Gen John Dillard and my son Thomas Bouldin my Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me made and declaring this to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I put my hand and seal here to this 27th of March 1825
