of the peace for the aforesaid County, Robert Allen and made oath that since the first of January last he has brought into the State of Virginia the place of his residence three Negroes viz One Negro Girl named Mahaly, two Negro boys named Moses and Abel, and that he did not buy the said Negroes or any one of them with intent to sell or trade the property, But bought & intended the said three Negroes for his own use, and that he will not make sale of the said Negroes Within two years from this date, Within the limits or boundaries of this State of Virginia - Given under our hands this 22^d day of May 1813.

This Indenture made this day of February in the year of our Lord eighteen-hundred and thirteen Between George Hairston jun. of the county of Henry and State of Virginia of the one part and Robert Rowland of said place of the other part Witnesseth that the said Robert Rowland in order to secure the payment of Two hundred and fifteen pounds fifteen shillings £ Current money of Virginia due to Robert Hairston and in consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Hairston before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, He the said Robert Rowland hath granted bargained and sold unto the said George Hairston jun. a Negro boy named Frank supposed to be about year old the same boy that the aforesaid R. Rowland purchased at the sale of Edward Roysters Estate, also one bay horse estimated at eight year old the said horse was raised by Col^t Woodding of Pittsylvania City and traded by the said Woodding to Timistall Coop who brought him to this County and sold him to George Hairston Jun. to have and to hold the said Negro boy named Frank that formerly belonged to Edward Royster and the said horse before mentioned above to the said George Hairston his heirs & assigns forever upon first. Nevertheless that the said George Hairston jun. as soon as conveniently he can after having advertised the time and place of the sale of the property before mentioned at one or two public places in the County proceed to sell the same to the highest bidder and out of the monies arising from the sale in the first place to pay and satisfy all reasonable charges attending such sale and then the debt above mentioned and the residue of the monies arising from such sale as aforesaid to the use of the said Rowland and his Heirs, as witness I hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th day of February 1813.
