The order made at the last term of this Court directing the acting Justices to be summoned to this Court for the purpose of recommending three of their body to the executive one of whom to be commissioned as Sheriff having been returned executed - The Court proceeded to vote vice vice for three of their body, when the vote stood for Dillard, Jos. Martin and Joseph Bouldin - Therefore it is ordered that John Dillard, Joseph Martin and Joseph Bouldin be recommended to the Executive, as proper persons one of whom is to be commissioned as Sheriff for the County of Henry.

Susan King the widow of Geo. W. King dec^d having renounced her right to qualify as admin^r of said estate On motion of Columbus King he is permitted to administer upon the said estate whereupon he took the oath required by Law and with Elcaney B. Turner and George Woody his securities entered into bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned according to Law and acknowledged the same.

State a negro woman slave the property of Peter Newton, charged with unlawfully and feloniously stabbing Peyton Conway, was this day put to the bar and upon her arraignment pleaded not guilty, whereupon the Court proceeded to examine divers witnesses as well on behalf of the Commonwealth as the prisoner at the bar who was defended by William Martin Esq. On consideration whereof the Court is unanimously of opinion that the prisoner is guilty of unlawful stabbing and entitled to the benefit of Clergy, and do sentence her to be burnt in the hand, and to receive ten lashes.

On motion of Marshall Newton & Alex. N. Bassett, ordered that Mary D. Philpott, admin^r of Charles D. Philpott, be summoned to appear here at December Court next, to give them counter security as her security for the admin^r of said estate.

On motion of Marshall Newton ordered that the unexpired Tavern license of J. Dimpsey be transferred to him.

An account of Anthony Saterfield amounting to \$11.78 allowed and ordered to be certified to the Auditor of public accounts.

An account of William Wells amounting to \$6.44 allowed and ordered to be certified to the Auditor of public accounts.

Ordered that the Court be adj^d till the first day of the next term.
