The last will and Testament of Alex^r Hunter dec^d

In the name of God amen Alexander Hunter dec^d being sick of Body but of perfect Mind and Memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following First I recommend my soul to God who first gave it me, and my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors, and touching my worldly Goods which has been pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner and form following I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha Hunter the third of all my Lands and Negroes and the third of all my Movable Property and household Goods named Cloe Exclusion besides her third to wait upon her during her life after her death my will is that Cloe Hunter Child of her should if she has any be equally divided & left to Peter Hunter, Samuel Hunter, Peyton Hunter Alexander Hunter & Powhatan Hunter to them and their Heirs forever and my wife Martha Hunter is to have the third of all my other Negroes and

Movable property to wait upon her during her life and when she comes
to die and leave this world I give my wife Martha Hunter full power
to leave her thirds of Movable property to any of her sons or daughters which
trick and ever her best in her latter days My will and desire is
that all my Lands & Negroes & Movable property except my wife thirds
that is not to be Consumed with during her life shall be sold immediately
after my death and my sons when they come to the age of Eighteen they
may take care of their own parts of my Estate which I have left them
and my will is that my youngest Childern legacy be left in my Exors
& Executors hands while they come to the age of fourteen years then they
may Chose Guardian to act for themselves and if any of the above named
sons shall die before they come of age to make a will their Estate
shall go and be left to the above named sons all my Lands and
their parts of my Movable property which I have left my sons
Peter Hunter, Samuel Hunter, Peyton Hunter Alexander Hunter &
Pawhatan Hunter I leave to them and their heirs for ever I
give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Polly Hunter one likely
Negro Wench & Child one good bed and furniture one Man named
